Ushare Childcare and Development	Provides links to open learning resources that have been recommended by lecturers, teachers, training providers and learners that support SQA qualifications. New resources and reviews can be submitted.	

### **Useful websites**

Zero to Three: national centre for infants, toddlers and families - This national nonprofit organisation provides information on topics such as child behaviour and development, care, education, maltreatment of children, and public policy.

<u>Education Scotland: early years</u> - Informative micro-site provided by Education Scotland. Includes information on the Early Years subset of the Curriculum for Excellence as well as resources such as frameworks, news and links to related organisations.

<u>National Literacy Trust</u> & <u>Scottish Book Trust</u> - Organisations that promote the importance of developing literacy skills from a young age. They provide resources and advice and also host initiatives to encourage reading and improve literacy at all ages.

<u>The Scottish Government: children, young people and families</u> - Micro-site providing comprehensive information on government initiatives and policies relating to children and families in Scotland.

NHS Choices: Live Well - Information from the NHS on healthy living, including dedicated sections on children's health.

<u>SSKS (Social Services Knowledge Scotland)</u> - Networked information for those working in health or social sciences with responsibility for early years (pre-birth to age 5) gathered on a central database.
