Complete Issues Online	This is a place where you can easily find articles, statistics, personal accounts and websites to help you quickly understand current issues.
Gale Cengage Learning	This is a collection of databases giving access to a wide range of resources:
- Gale Virtual Reference Library (GVRL)	Collection of specialised reference sources for multidisciplinary research.
- General OneFile	Database of 13, 000 journals and 120 million full-text articles dating from 1980 to present.
- JISC FE Custom News	Database which contains over 25 million full text articles from over 200 worldwide newspapers
